### Summary

Round 17 saw a number of upsets across both Reserve and First Grade games on Sunday. Woongarra Reserve Grade produced what can only be described as the upset of the round, defeating 1<sup>st</sup> place Terrigal at Hamlyn Terrace. East Gosford put on a show at the other end of the Coast, holding league heavyweights Gosford to only 1-0 wins in both grades. East Gosford First Grade put in a heroic effort against 1<sup>st</sup> place Gosford, holding them to nil until the 86<sup>th</sup> minute in what can only be described as a valiant but heartbreaking moment for the Rams. In other games across the weekend, First Grade Umina and Southern Ettalong battled it out to come away with 1 point each in a 2 all draw, as the competition for second place heats up.

#### **Reserve Grade: Woongarra (5) V Terrigal (2)**

Terrigal were slow to start in their clash against last place Woongarra, and quickly learnt their lesson to not take their opposition lightly. Terrigal gave away a penalty in the 3<sup>rd</sup> minute, and this set the tone for the match as Woongarra converted coolly. Terrigal got their heads in the game (literally) and responded quickly with a header from Tiegan Kavanagh to equalise in the 9<sup>th</sup> minute. Woongarra hit back almost instantly, scoring again in the 10<sup>th</sup> minute, and then again in 30<sup>th</sup> to take them 3-1 up over the competition leaders. Tiegan Kavanagh found the net for Terrigal just before halftime off the end of a free kick to go into the break 3-2 down. Woongarra came out firing in the second half, not wanting to let their lead over Terrigal slip. A further two goals to Woongarra saw them seal a win for only the third time this season, with Keanah Scholes netting 4 goals, and Alisha Rias scoring one for the Wildcats.

### **First Grade: Woongarra (0) V Terrigal (3)**

After Reserve Grade's surprising loss, Terrigal First Grade were looking to secure a win at Hamlyn Terrace for the club. Learning from Reserve Grade's mistakes, Terrigal came out ready to play, as Emma Noro scored from a free kick in the 3<sup>rd</sup> minute to put Terrigal on the scoresheet. Despite this, Woongarra held their own and put on an impressive display of defence to keep the opposition from doubling their lead. Going into the break 1-0 down, Woongarra came out at firing and looking for the equaliser. However, it wasn't to be as Terrigal's Karen Douthy scored in the 53<sup>rd</sup> minute before Elly Bibby sealed the win for Terrigal from a corner. The final score was 3-0 to Terrigal as they came away with the 3 points.

### **Reserve Grade: East Gosford (0) V Gosford (1)**

Taking the field with a number of fill in players and an overwhelming 11 players under the age of 18 in the Reserve Grade squad, East Gosford were concerned about their clash with second place Gosford. Despite this, the Rams came out firing and were unlucky not to take the lead in the first half. Their defence was strong whilst their attacking players were causing havoc for a sluggish Gosford outfit. The game went into halftime nil all, and both teams came out ready to play after the break. A lapse in concentration and defence for East Gosford became their undoing, as Gosford managed to find the back of the net through Abbey Muspratt. This goal was to be the only for the game, as Gosford came away with a 1-nil win.

### **First Grade: East Gosford (0) V Gosford (1)**

In what can only be described as one of their best performances of the season, 7<sup>th</sup> place East Gosford managed to hold out competition leaders Gosford until the dying minutes of the game. Like Reserve Grade, the East Gosford First Grade contained a number of girls called up from the U15s and U16s to fill in for the squad, which shows the talent of their juniors coming through. Gosford struggled to get into the game, and had trouble breaking through East Gosford's strong defensive line and getting a chance on goals. Halftime came and went as the score remained nil all, as Naomi Abbot narrowly missed for the Rams in the second half. With chances for both teams few and far between, the game was played in the middle of the park. It wasn't until the 86<sup>th</sup> minute that Gosford managed to break through the Rams defence and find the back of the net through Golden Boot frontrunner Jess Dominello, finishing the game 1-0 to Gosford. A heartbreaking loss for East Gosford, but an excellent performance against the benchmark team of SWL.

### **Reserve Grade: Kanwal (1) V Kincumber (0)**

Kincumber defied their 6<sup>th</sup> place position on the ladder during this game, and really took it to the 3<sup>rd</sup> place Kanwal outfit. Kincumber were unlucky not to take the lead during the first half after a number of chances on goal, whilst Kanwal was limited to long range shots as they struggled to break down the defence. The second half began to play out much the same as the first, with Kanwal limited to long range shots as Kincumber showed a strong defensive display. However, it was one of these long range shots from Tenielle Mahon that managed to find the back of the net, to give Kanwal the lead. This was to be the only goal of the game, as Kanwal hung on for the win 1-0.

### **First Grade: Kanwal (4) V Kincumber (0)**

This game was a replay of last year's Division 1 grand final and saw Kanwal come away with a comfortable 4-0 win to keep their finals hopes alive. Kanwal dominated this game from kick off, with Jo Walker and Hayley Walker both scoring in the first half to take the game into the break 2-0 up. Fatigue got the better of Kincumber, as a number of players backed up from Reserve Grade for this game. Despite this, they did well to hold Kanwal, as they managed to only net another 2 goals in the second half. A second goal to Ballard and another to Jennifer Reeves rounded out the scoring, as Kanwal came away with a comfortable 4-0 win over a depleted Kincumber side.

### Reserve Grade: Umina (6) V Southern Ettalong (0)

The Reserve Grade Umina V Southern Ettalong match saw Umina come away with a comfortable 6-0 win over their 7<sup>th</sup> placed opponents. Unfortunately for Southern Ettalong, they just couldn't get into the game as Umina dominated the midfield. The first half saw 2 early goals to Umina, followed by one towards the end of the first half. The second half was much the same, although Southern created a couple of late chances but struggled to convert. A goal early in the second half saw Umina go 4-0 up, as Southern managed to hold their opposition out for the majority of the second half. Fatigue got the better of them towards the end of the game though, as Umina scored another 2 quick goals in the last 15 minutes. The game saw goals to Umina's Sam Fulwood, Kristi Barry, Emily Yannis and a hat trick to Amber Mangan.

### First Grade: Umina (2) V Southern Ettalong (2)

This Round 17 clash between 2<sup>nd</sup> place Umina and 3<sup>rd</sup> place Southern Ettalong was must win game for both teams. With only 2 points separating these teams on the First-Grade ladder, both were looking for those three points in this match up. From kick off, both teams were competitive and looking to score. Abbie Dickson for Umina was first on the scoreboard, converting a cross from Kate Styles on the right-hand side. Southern Ettalong quickly responded off a free kick from Tahlor Thackray, which was controlled and finished off by Tatum Ansiewicz in the box. Both teams continued to have a number of chances on goal, and it was a poor goal clearance by Southern that led to the next goal. The clearance was kicked directly into Abbie Dickson and the ball deflected like a rocket into the net for her second goal, to take Umina into the break 2-1 up. The second half saw both teams come out ready to play, with a number of chances on goal and some good goal keeping from each side. The only goal in the second 45 minutes came from Tahlor Thackray in the middle of the park to equalise. The score remained 2-2 between these two closely matched teams and both came away with a point each. The race to the finals continues as Umina take on 8<sup>th</sup> place Kincumber, whilst Southern will verse 6<sup>th</sup> place Woongarrah.
