Premier Autocare Association Cup 2023

Competition Details

The Association Cup will run from Friday 3rd March to Sunday 19th March inclusive, semifinals being played 25/26th March & the Grand Final being played on 25th April.

The highest ranked teams within their pool will progress into a final series.

Rules and Operational Procedures

- Games will be played on Friday evenings & Sundays; therefore, teams must be available to play all these days.
- There is the possibility of Saturday games if Friday nights are washed out.
- No concessions will be made for teams that cannot field an appropriate number of players.

Semi Finals: *25/26th March*

Grand Finals: *25th April (Anzac Day)*

Registration

All players must be **registered and ACTIVE in MyCompApp as well as allocated to their respective team** to compete in the 2023 Premier Autocare Association Cup. Players will be unable to play if they are not an ACTIVE Registered player for the 2023 season or if they are not allocated to a team.

Team Registration through MyCompApp

Team registrations for the 2023 Premier Autocare Association Cup will be managed through MyCompApp as per the steps set out below. Please note that players must be registered for the 2023 season in order to allocate them to the team.

Step 1 – Selecting Teams

CCF has set up your teams for the Pre-Season Cup.

All you have to do is allocate your Pre-Season Cup players to these teams. The names are outlined below.

Step 2 – Player Allocation MyCompApp

Team Sheets

All teams will be allowed a maximum of 16 players on the MyCompApp Team Sheet throughout the tournament.

Location:

Pre-Season Cup games will be played at Pluim Park, Budgewoi Soccer Club and Mingara. All finals will be played at locations determined by CCF.

Washouts:

If single matches are washed out, there will be no replays, the tables will be percentage based.

If semi-finals are washed out – Central Coast Football will determine the rescheduling of matches.

Forfeits:

Teams that forfeit will be awarded zero points and a 3-0 score line will be recorded against the forfeiting team. CCF must be notified of any forfeits by 12:00PM Friday or 24hrs prior for a midweek match. If CCF is not notified by this time- the forfeiting team will be required to pay 100% of the referee’s fees for the match. The club will be invoiced for the forfeit by CCF. Clubs may incur additional fines at the discretion of CCF.

Referees:

Referees fees will be paid via Electronic Transfer. No Cash is required for the Pre-Season Cup.

Game Times

The game times for the Pre-Season Cup will be 45 minutes each way for both the Men's and Women's competition. There will be no time added on.

Interchange

The 2023 Pre-Season Cup will allow unlimited interchange for all matches including finals matches.

Match Balls

All teams are expected to provide two match balls each game.

Competition Format

Men's Competition Format

Teams have been placed in 2 pools. The competition will be a modified round robin format, with each team playing 3 games & ladders will be percentage based.

- Pool A will have 5 BPL teams & 5 Div 1 teams.
- Pool B will have 5 BPL teams & 4 Div 1 teams.

The finals series will consist of Semi Finals and a Final. The top 2 teams from each pool will go through to the semi-finals:

- Winner of Pool A will play the Runner up of Pool B
- Winner of Pool B will play the Runner up of Pool A
- Winner of these matches playing the grand final - Anzac Day

The procedure for determining the order of teams will be the following:

1. Points Percentage
2. Goal Difference
3. Goals Scored
4. Playoff match

Women's Competition Format

Teams have been placed in a single pool. The competition will be a modified round robin format, with each team playing 3 games & ladders will be percentage based.

The finals series will consist of Semi Finals and a Final. The top 4 teams will go through to the semi-finals:

- 1st Placed Team vs 4th Placed Team
- 2nd Placed Team vs 3rd Placed Team
- Winners through to Grand Final

The procedure for determining the order of teams will be the following:

1. Points Percentage
2. Goal Difference
3. Goals Scored
4. Following CCF Rules and regulations

Finals

If the scores are even at fulltime in the semi or grand final then there will be 30 minutes of extra time, 15 minutes each way. The golden goal rule will be enforced. If scores are still even after extra time, then a penalty shootout will take place.

Judiciary

Current Suspended Players

Players who are suspended for a time period rather than matches for example: Suspended until 31st December 2023, will be ineligible to participate in any football activity, including Association Cup, until the suspension term is completed.

Suspensions received in the Winter Season/Final Series of 2022 will not count towards as serving the suspension in the Pre-Season Cup, these suspended players are eligible to play in the Association Cup.

Offences in the Pre-Season Cup

Yellow Cards

Accumulation of yellow cards in the Pre-Season Cup that do not result in suspension **will not** be carried over into the 2023 Winter Season. However, if a player incurs three yellow cards, they will be suspended for the next match regardless of whether it is a Pre-Season Cup match or Winter Season Round. If this suspension is unable to be served in the Pre-Season Cup, it will carry over into the first round of the 2023 Winter Season.

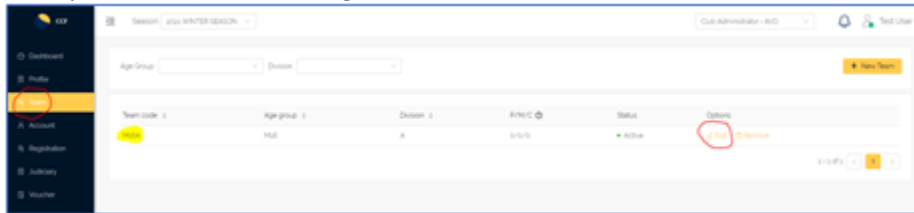
Suspensions

If a player incurs a suspension that exceeds the number of matches available in the Cup to serve this suspension, it will carry over to the subsequent rounds of the 2023 Winter Season.

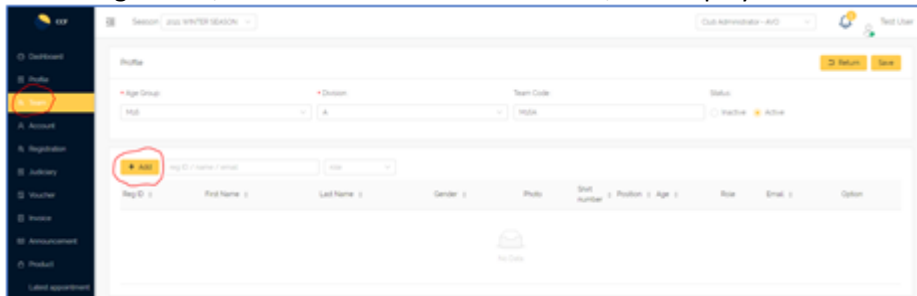
All other offences follow the Grievance and Disciplinary Regulations for Season 2023.

ADDING PLAYERS TO TEAMS:

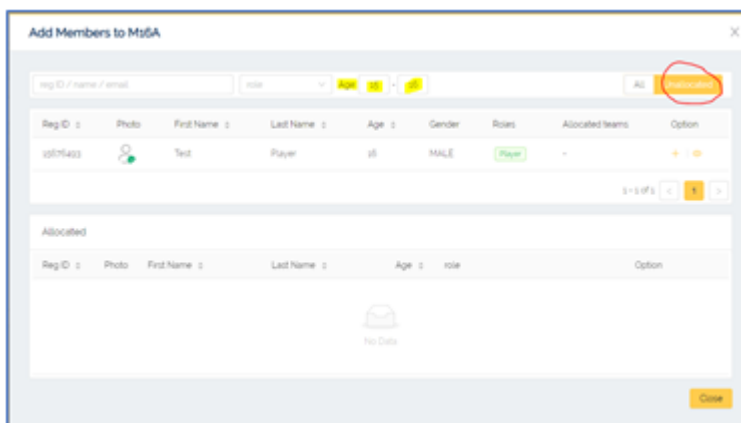
- a. From the left Menu, choose “Teams” and find the Team you want to add a player to from the list. Click on Edit (pencil icon) from the right:



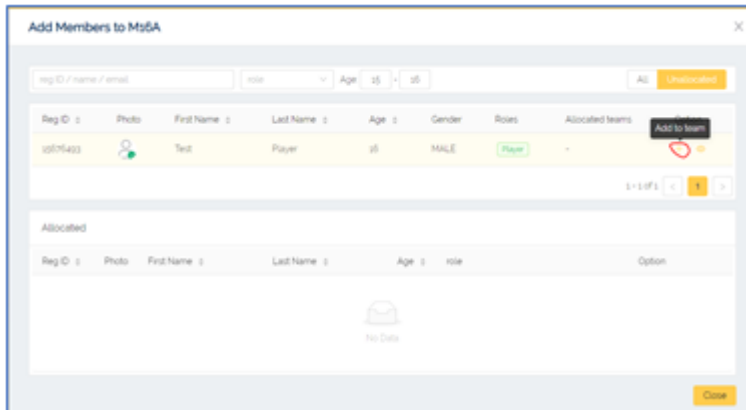
- b. From the resulting screen, click on “Add” in the middle left, to add players:



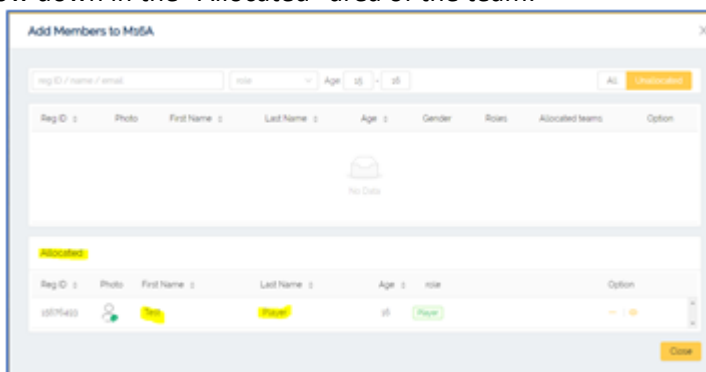
- c. The resulting screen allows you to filter players from the top fields, to make it easier to find them, to add them to the team:



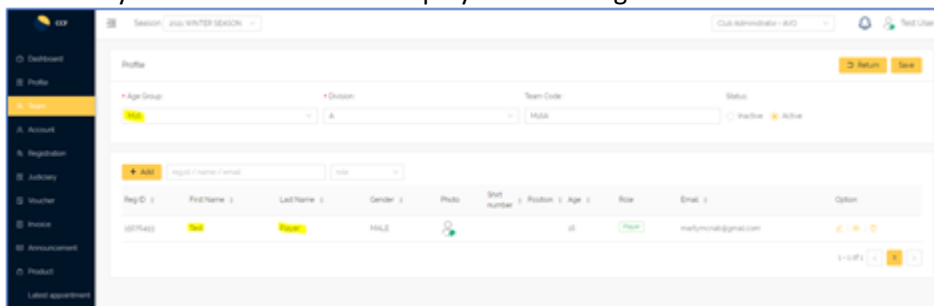
- d. Once the player you want to add to the team is found, choose the “+” icon at the right:



- e. Click “OK” to the confirmation prompt that you wish to add that player to the team. They should now show down in the “Allocated” area of the team:



- f. Click “Close” and you will now see that the player is showing in the list of the M16A team:



- g. Click on “Save” & then “Return” at the top right to go back to the main Teams list page. The team (M16A) will now show “1/0/0” under the “P/M/C” column. This is the “Players/Managers/Coaches” column, so it now shows the one Player and no Manager or Coach yet. This is a quick overview of the numbers and types currently allocated into each team:
